

The Gálvez Story: How it will be told

The entry point of presenting the forty year life of Gálvez can be scripted at several key events, then "flash-back" to encapsulate his early life. Here is how we envision the estimated time segments:

• Early stages: 1746 - 1768 (20%)

Influences and growth experiences in Spain; humble family life; the fate of Uncle Jose de Gálvez with King Carlos III; Canary Islands period; Seven Years War and early military life (Portuguese War).

• Military Emergence: New Spain, France, & Algiers 1769 – 1776 (15%)

This segment showcases the building blocks of leadership through severe tests, international experience, and tenacity for Gálvez. In Mexico, as a captain, he fights the Apaches. In 1770, he is promoted to commandant of arms of the northern provinces of New Spain. He returns to Spain in the company of his uncle, José de Gálvez. Later, schooled in Pau, France, he serves with the Royal Cantabria regiment. In 1775 he participates in a disastrous expedition to Algiers and is seriously wounded when Spanish forces assault the fortress that guards the city; later appointed a professor at the military academy of Ávila and promoted to lieutenant colonel. He is made colonel in 1776.

• Gov. of Louisiana/American Revolution 1776 – 1783 (45%)

Here we see the culmination of his growth as a new leader and his ability to change the outcome of history for Spain and the struggling American forces. In 1777, Bernardo de Gálvez becomes the new governor of the former French province of Louisiana, and promoted to Brigadier General in 1779. He marries Marie Félicité d'Estrehan (St. Maxent), the daughter of Gilbert Antoine de Saint-Maxent and wins the favor of the local Creole population. They have three children.

A master plan forms between King Carlos III and Gálvez. The Spanish will secretly sell the Americans desperately needed supplies, using the route from New Orleans up the Mississippi River. Gálvez works with Oliver Pollock, an American patriot, to ship massive supplies to the American rebels on the Ohio and Mississippi rivers, including the Illinois Regiment under George Rogers Clark.

Systematically, Gálvez collapses the British control in the Gulf of Mexico. This includes his masterful military campaigns throughout the lower Mississippi Valley and the Gulf of Mexico, relieving the threat to New Orleans. His support comes from Texas (via cattle drives) and from diverse groups in Louisiana. Gálvez's most important military victory over the British forces occurs in 1781, when he attacks and takes Pensacola, the British capital of West Florida, leaving the British without bases. He is present to sign the Treaty of Paris in 1783.











Viceroy of New Spain, Death, Life Summary, & Memorials (20%)

The last three years of Gálvez's life is beyond extraordinary. In 1783, he is raised to the rank of count, promoted to lieutenant-general of the army, and appointed governor and captain-general of Cuba. Shortly after his father, Matías de Gálvez y Gallardo dies in November 1784, Bernardo is appointed to fill the position of Viceroy.

During his administration, two natural calamities occur – a drought causing famine, and a typhus epidemic that kills 300,000 people the same year. During the famine, Gálvez donates 12,000 pesos of his inheritance, and 100,000 pesos he raises from other sources to buy maize and beans for the populace. He also implements policies to increase future agricultural production.

In 1785, Gálvez continues reconstruction of Chapultepec Castle, the towers of the Cathedral of Mexico, paving of the streets, and installation of street lights in Mexico City. He continued work on the highway to Acapulco, and took measures to reduce the abuse of Indian labor on the project.





After the typhus epidemic had abated in early autumn, Bernardo de Gálvez apparently became one of its last victims and dies November 30, 1786, at the age of 40. His body is buried next to his father in the Church of San Fernando, and his heart is placed in an urn and reposed in the Cathedral of Mexico.
