
Order of Granaderos y Damas de Gálvez San Antonio Chapter

The Education Committee is a very important function in our chapter. It is chaired by Walter Herbeck and includes dedicated members Joe González, Janie Rodriguez and Rafael Cavazos. The committee was formed only a few months ago and has already completed three projects. Their first project was to revise our chapter's brochure that we hand out. The new brochure is printed on heavier paper and has a full-color image of Bernardo de Gálvez with nicer fonts and improved overall design. Information on it has been updated. It contains information on our chapter as well as Gálvez to include our mission statement, membership, contact information and recommended reading material. It is a great resource for us to promote our organization. Several hundreds of these have already been handed out at events in July and August.

The second project is the purchase of 43 copies of the November 2000 issue of Cobblestone magazine featuring Spain and the American Revolution. It is a full-color booklet filled with articles and puzzles for readers ages 9 to 14. We have already sold a couple of these magazines and they will be a great promotional tool and fund raiser.

The third project is resource packets for teachers that include a booklet by Judge Robert Thonhoff titled The Vital Contribution of Spain in the Winning of the American Revolution, the TEKS learning objectives for 7th & 8th grade social studies, an article from the Texas

Dr. Terrence Burke, Jr. stands proudly next to his recently acquired certificate of membership to the *Order of Granaderos y Damas de Gálvez*, which was presented to him by Colonel Martin Franklin McGuill, USAF J.C.D., Chaplain at the Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, Virginia. The presentation was made at the National Institute of Health (N.I.H.) Chapel located in Bethesda,

Maryland following Mass. Dr. Burke assists Father McGuill on Sundays in performing Mass to the patients and staff of N.I.H. The Institute is the nation's medical research agency.

Dr. Burke was excited to receive his certificate and is proud of his direct ancestor François Marcanatel, who was a militiaman under General Gálvez during the American Revolution. In records acquired from the General Archives of the Indies, Seville, España Papeles Procedentes de Cuba, "Francois Marcantel is listed under Compañia de Milicia Urbana de Partido de Opelusas and was 38 years old, enjoyed robust health, and was responsible for one rifle."

Dr. Terrence Burke is a proud recent member of the Order of Granaderos y Damas de Gálvez and is also a member of the Sons of the American Revolution. In addition to members Clifford and Lynda Normand, Dr. Terrence Burke also has ancestors who served directly under the leadership of General Gálvez.

Show Your Pride



Judge Robert Thonhoff proudly displayed the current U.S. flag and the Spanish Burgundian Cross flag at his home on June 20, 2018, in remembrance and honor of Governor Bernardo de Gálvez's emissary, Francisco García, delivering the letter requesting Texas cattle to Texas Governor Domingo Cabello in San Antonio on June 20, 1779. That just happened

to be one day before Spain officially declared war against Great Britain

on June 21, 1779. (King Carlos III had previously declared his intention to declare war against Great Britain on May 18, 1779.)

Governor Joe Perez displays his Granadero pride with the home address on his driveway accented with a flaming grenade, matching the one on our chapter's website.




THE TWO OPPOSING FLAGS AT THE BATTLE OF MEDINA



The letter from the King's Chief of Protocol thanks us for participating in the Tricentennial event at the Bexar County Courthouse and refers to books presented to the King and Queen. The books were given to the City of San Antonio Office of International Affairs for presentation to the King and Queen. The books and booklets are described below by author Robert H. Thonhoff.

The SPANISH TEXAS TRILOGY slipcase set is covered in crimson color with gold letters and brands, the colors of Spain. Significantly, one of the brands is the Royal Brand, which was used to mark the horses that belonged to the King of Spain. The set holds three of my books, all personally autographed on behalf of the San Antonio Founding Chapter of the Order of Granaderos y Damas de Gálvez for King Felipe VI and Queen Letizia.

The set contains three mint copies of my books, *The Texas Connection with the*

American Revolution; Forgotten Battlefield of the First Texas Revolution: The Battle of Medina, August 18, 1813; and El Fuerte del Cíbolo: Sentinel of the Béxar-La Bahía Ranches.










Minutes for the meeting held <u>August 1, 2018</u> at La Fonda Restaurant Submitted by Joe Perez

- The meeting commenced at 7:45 p.m.
- Chaplain Joe González gave the Invocation.
- Rueben Perez led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Governor Joe Perez welcomed guest Daphne Ybarbo.
- Treasurer Manny Rodriguez gave the Treasurer's Report for June and July. In June, we had a Beginning Balance of \$2,703.25; Expenses of \$259.00 for the purchase of 500 brochures, Income of \$85.22 from dues, the sale of a membership certificate and account dividend, leaving an Ending Balance of \$2,529.47. In July, we had a Beginning Balance of \$2,529.47, Expenses of \$37.50 for rental of chairs for 4th of July ceremony, Income of \$0.21 from account dividend, leaving an Ending Balance of \$2,492.18. A motion to accept the report was made by Walter Herbeck and seconded by Eileen Barrientos. After a vote, the motion carried.
- Education Committee Chair had his committee give a report to the membership. Joe González said we will print 500 revised brochures to distribute. He informed us of the Gálvez packet they are making to give to schools for teachers to use and showed us the items in the packets, which consists of learning materials and a lesson plan for teachers. Stella González mentioned that if anyone knows a school teacher or administrator, to let the committee know as that may open the door for us at that school. Janie Rodriguez read the minutes of the last committee meeting and announced that they spoke with a studio about using the facility for a promotional video. Walter said he will speak to the San Antonio Library system about getting our information to them and about us giving presentations. Governor Perez said that we give presentations every year at different libraries but Walter said he will go to the head of the library system. Janie Rodriguez presented an issue of Cobblestone magazine that is all about Spain's participation in the American Revolution and said 43 copies are available to purchase for under \$6.00 each. Jimmy Peet moved that we purchase them and Dorothy Perez seconded the motion. After discussion and a vote, the motion carried. Yolanda Kirkpatrick moved that when we sell them as a fundraiser that the cost goes to the general fund and the profit goes to the Education Committee. Jimmy Peet seconded the motion and after discussion and a vote, the motion carried. Rafael Cavazos mentioned that the committee will develop a plan to use the public access studio to film a promotional video for the group.
- Joe Perez announced our newest member who signed up this evening: Monica Aguayo Johnson.
- Ricky Reyes reminded everyone about the upcoming Battle of Medina symposium.
- The meeting was adjourned at 9:04.
